**WHO:** The Sudbury Kart Club presently has a 4 cycle restricted junior class 7-15 yrs. , a senior 4 cycle class 16-60+ yrs., and a senior 100cc 2 cycle 16-60+ yrs. We hope to start a cadet class 7-11 yrs. of age this season. We are also looking for volunteer members to help flag, be marshals, look after safety and do tech inspections.

**WHAT:** The kart club is a group of people who want to organize races for karting in our area. "Karting" is not a home-made kart with an old lawnmower engine attached to it. Only karts manufactured to technical and safety regulations enforced by ASN Canada FIA, may be used for kart racing. As well, engines to be used by Sudbury Kart Club members must also comply with ASN guidelines. We use Honda 4 cycle and Yamaha 100cc 2 cycle engines (senior class only). By following these regulations we hope to offer safe, stable low cost racing.

**WHERE:** Sudbury club members will have access to the facilities at Sudbury Kartways Inc. on specified times during the season.

Orientation and instruction will be provided by current members to ensure all new members know the basics of karting. There will be limited storage space for karts only, available from Sudbury Kartways Inc. and a pit area designated near the batting cages with access to the track. There are scheduled races for the season, all locally sponsored.

**WHEN:** Race karts are at no time allowed on the track with rental karts. Race days are on Sunday mornings from 8am to noon. Sudbury Kartways also allows shared use of the track on specified days for practice times.

**WHY:** The present executive of Sudbury Kart Club is dedicated our club and promoting kart racing to Northern Ontario. Karting is a very safe and inexpensive form of motorsport racing that is growing, not only in Ontario and Canada but in many countries around the world.

Karting is very much a family oriented sport that can provide children with a commitment to learn about all aspects of "karting" as well as sportsmanship and friendships. It also provides parents with a means of participating with their children in a sport that can be mutually satisfying. Every racer needs their pit crew behind them 100%!

For the adult racer, it finally gives them a chance to actually participate in competitive motor sport for a reasonable cost with all the thrills of real racing! For all those people that already know, "It's an itch that just won't go away!"

**SAFTEY:** Is probably the number one question on most parents minds. As soon as you mention racing, most people they think the worst. Compared to other types of racing Kart racing can be one of the safest types of competitive sports available to the public. Our club is affiliated with ASN in order to make racing here as safe as possible. The ASN organization has many years of karting and auto racing behind them with a proven track record and a long list of safety regulations intended to keep karting safe.

**RACE:** Karts unlike many other motor vehicles you may purchase are to be used in a controlled environment where rules and regulations must be followed. Not only can it sustain a child or adult with the need to "go fast", it can also relieve family members concern of "where are they?", because your likely going to be there watching and helping them.

**COST:** Another big question is how much? Karting compared to many other types of sports can be relatively inexpensive. Compared to motor sports it is definitely the least expensive. Four cycle karts vary in cost from \$1500.00 used to \$4500.00 for a new and complete models. Club membership fees as well as race entry fees are to be determined by the club depending upon the number of participants . The club is a registered club dedicated to it's members and the promotion of the sport.
